2023 NAHMA SCHOLARS

The NAHMA Educational Foundation selected 111 student residents to receive scholarships in 2023. Each scholarship was worth \$3,500; the total amount of scholarship money awarded was \$388,500. Additionally, \$2,000 was donated to the Department of Apparel, Housing, and Resource Management at Virginia Tech for scholarships for students pursuing their bachelor's degree in property management.

This year's class of NAHMA Scholars came from 18 different states and represents 11 regional Affordable Housing Management Associations (AHMAs). 





ENDURING SUPPORT




