Alexandria, Va., Feb. 4, 2015 — While in Washington, D.C., for the National Affordable Housing Management Association (NAHMA)'s Federal Affairs Issues winter meeting, March 8-10, make sure your voice gets heard on affordable housing issues important to you by scheduling visits with your local senator or representative and their staff; and let NAHMA make sure your name gets in the appointment book.

NAHMA will be providing members with concise talking points and one-page legislative overviews to prepare for and facilitate the Hill meetings.
