The NAHMA forum focuses on public policy and takes place, June 15, at Parc 55 San Francisco, a Hilton Hotel. The association's hotel block is at the same location. In all, the NAHMA summer forum is jam packed with committee meetings as well as two educational panels. Furthermore, the keynote speaker is Carol Galante, faculty director of the Turner Center for Housing Innovation at University of California, Berkeley, and former assistant secretary for housing/federal housing commissioner at HUD. The Vanguard Award winners will also be honored during the luncheon ceremony. The forum concludes with the NAHMA Educational Foundation [dinner](#) and fundraiser at Twenty Five Lusk. Additionally, NAHMA will present four panels at the NAA conference.

The first educational panel at the NAHMA forum—led by Vivian Wan, chief operating officer, Abode Services; Alex Chan, manager, advisory services, Nonprofit Finance Fund; and Danielle Wildkress, associate director, Corporation for Supportive Housing—explores the pay-for-success (PFS) model and how it is being used in the affordable housing industry. The panelists will outline the PFS concept, structure and how to bring investors to the table using specific examples of current pay-for-success projects. Immediately following will be a panel led by Gwen Volk, president, Gwen Volk Infocus Inc., and Larry Sisson, president, TESCO Properties Inc., that will discuss the most recent updates on fair housing issues.
