Preregistration for the NAHMA March Meeting Closes Friday

Alexandria, Va., Feb. 21, 2018 — This is your last chance to register online for the National Affordable Housing Management Association (NAHMA) annual [winter meeting](#). After Friday, Feb. 23, only walk-in registration will be accepted on-site beginning at 8 a.m., March 4. [Preregistering](#) online for the meeting saves time—allowing you to grab your badge and go at meeting check in.

The meeting, focused on federal policy issues, takes place at the Fairmont Washington, 2401 M St. NW, Washington, D.C., March 4-6. The annual three-day conference features educational panels, networking opportunities, NAHMA committee meetings, the Industry Awards ceremony and the Communities of Quality (COQ) Awards luncheon. It concludes with prearranged Capitol Hill meetings with congressional representatives and their staff.

New this year is the NAHMA Members Talk Trends and Best Practices panel, Sunday, March 4, featuring three half-hour sessions focused on key topics presented in an interactive format. Additionally, senior leadership from the Department of Housing and Urban Development's Office of Multifamily Housing and the Real Estate Assessment Center, the Department of Agriculture's Rural Housing Service, the Housing Partnership Network, Enterprise Community Partners and the Caleb Group have already been confirmed as speakers for the panels offered Monday and Tuesday.

Event registration includes admission to all of the sessions and committee meetings, as well as the COQ Awards luncheon and Industry Awards ceremony.
