

Minutes
AHMA Liaison and Executive Directors Meeting
The Fairmont, Washington, DC
Sunday, March 4, 2018

The meeting was called to order at 12:35 p.m. by President-Elect Tim Zaleski, Chairman of the committee.

- Welcome—A welcome was extended to all members and attendees by the Chairman.
- Introduction—All committee members and guests were asked to introduce themselves and to give their respective titles or positions at their AHMA. After each introduction, each participant was asked to give an update and share comments on their AHMA's unique plans or possible challenges in 2018.
- PennDel AHMA – Will be working on putting together an educational offering for Rural Housing training purposes.
- JAHMA—Focusing on maintenance training and continues to partner with Rocky AHMA for webinars.
- SAHMA—Holds nine state meetings. SAHMA has reached the ½ million-dollar plateau in scholarships they have awarded since 2003.
- AHMA East Texas—Having success in bringing in new younger members. Will be holding its 3rd BOWLA-AHMA event.
- NEAHMA—Will be holding maintenance training at Gillette Stadium. The half-day fair training session has proven to be very popular.
- PAHMA—Planning a fall conference. Fair Housing training and SHCM course scheduled for the spring.
- ROCKY AHMA—Had 60 participants in a recent webinar.
- AHMA PSW—AZ held a successful meeting; CA event usually attracts up to 900 attendees; AHMA PSW rewrote its bylaws and named many new Board members. Their foundation awards over \$50k in scholarships. They continue to work jointly with others in conducting webinars.
- Idaho AHMA—Working with state housing finance agency on training, also working with an attorney on training for fair housing.
- Mid-Atlantic AHMA—Gearing up to re-do their web site. Working on a full slate of training with A.J. Johnson. Donates \$15k a year to the NAHMA Foundation. Also considering an open house, either in house or on-line.
- NAHMA Education Foundation—The mid-year follow up on the one hundred and thirty 2017 scholarship recipients has been done. 21.5% of those recipients have graduated. 417 total individuals have received scholarships and 123 individuals have graduated. For 2018, 100 applications have been filed; 55 applicants were previous recipients.

Community Force, the Foundation software provider did an applicant completion webinar. The AHMA Executive Directors have passwords to review scholarship status on the NAHMA web site.

There being no old or new business, the meeting was adjourned at 1:30 p.m.
