Fox, McGrath Issue Educational Foundation Fundraising Challenge

Alexandria, Va., Sept. 25, 2018 — This year's Inspiration Award honorees are issuing a donation challenge to benefit the National Affordable Housing Management Association (NAHMA) Educational Foundation's scholarship fund. Every dollar donated to the foundation in the name of the Jim and Wayne Inspiration Award fund will be matched, up to a total of \$50,000. Wayne Fox and James McGrath, both past presidents of NAHMA, and the former chair and vice chair respectively of the NAHMA Educational Foundation, will be honored with the 2018 Inspiration Award at the foundation's annual gala Oct. 22, taking place in conjunction with NAHMA's fall conference in Washington, D.C. The foundation will be recognizing the pair for their many years of work in furthering the availability of scholarships for residents of affordable housing.

During the period when Fox served as chair and McGrath served as vice chair of the foundation, they were instrumental in increasing the annual giving to the foundation by more than 400 percent, to ultimately support the awarding of more than 60 scholarships nationally each year.

Currently, the foundation awards \$2,500 to each scholarship recipient. With the money awarded in 2018, the grand total of scholarship money distributed over the 12-year history of the program now exceeds \$1,400,000.

As strong believers in teamwork, they had this to say about their roles in supporting the scholarship program: "If you believe in the value of affordable housing as a vehicle to allow families to live in safe, decent and affordable homes, and you want them to be able to raise their children in a manner which provides the most upwardly mobile opportunities, then providing scholarships to enable the children in affordable housing to attend college is a logical next step."

To reinforce this concept, and in celebration of the award that they will be receiving, Fox and McGrath have created a matching gift fund, whereas any donations given in the name of the Jim and Wayne Inspiration Award fund will be matched one-for-one up to a total of \$50,000, as a way to challenge NAHMA and AHMA members to give a heartfelt charitable donation to the NAHMA Educational Foundation.

Fox and McGrath believe strongly in the concept of giving back and would like to encourage and ask each of you to join them in this effort. Suggested donations to the Jim and Wayne Inspiration Award fund include:
