The three-day NAHMA meeting takes place at the Fairmont Washington, 2401 M St. NW, Washington, D.C., March 3-5, and features educational panels, networking opportunities, the Industry Awards evening reception and the Communities of Quality (COQ) Awards luncheon. The event concludes with prearranged Capitol Hill meetings with congressional representatives and their staff.

The discounted rooms are booked on a first-come, first-served basis and expire on or before Feb. 10, depending on availability. The room reservation requires a separate registration from the NAHMA meeting.

The annual conference features a number of educational panels specifically geared toward the affordable housing industry that are led by the people who are experts in their fields. Panels featuring government officials and other special guests are not open to the media and may not be recorded.

Event <u>registration</u> includes admission to all of the sessions, as well as the COQ Awards luncheon and Industry Awards ceremony, both of which take place Monday, March 4.
