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### 2001 Super NOFA Federal Register February 26, 2001

Yesterday HUD published the 2001 Super NOFA. The document is 788 pages overall, it was broken up for publication into 16 parts. In addition to being available on the Federal Register Website, you can also access it in order on HUD's website at :
